As we reflect back on our milestone 40th anniversary celebration, we continue to be proud of the work our dedicated staff and volunteers have accomplished in the last 12 months. Each year brings new milestones: 2018-2019 was no different, bringing with it new funding and service offerings, inspiring our organization to better serve our clients and the broader community.

In January 2019, Rexdale Women's Centre was awarded funds to address the challenges visible minority newcomer women experience in entering the labour market. Our new Women's Employment Resource Centre opened its doors in March 2019. The resource centre is equipped to assist drop-in clients, as well as to provide registered services and sessions. Also in March, we expanded our Dixon and Islington Youth Hub, and we co-hosted our first Youth Summit, in partnership with Humber College, to inspire youth to become tomorrow's leaders.

We are proud to report that our dedicated teams of staff and volunteers assisted over 13,000 individuals this past year, helping them to address their needs and to successfully overcome personal challenges.

The commitment of staff and volunteers to our community is exemplary, and at the very heart of this organization. We are committed to assisting our clients to live healthy, happy and productive lives, succeeding and contributing to their communities.

Additionally, our work with clients could not be achieved without the support and stewardship of the board of directors.
